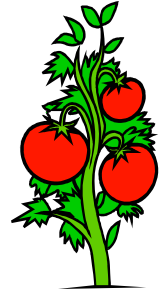

Gleaning

is the act of collecting leftover crops from farmers' fields after they have been harvested. The Torah teaches us that gleaning was required by farmers. We are instructed to leave some food for the poor and the stranger. This is an ancient form of Tzedakah.



LEVITICUS 19:9 'Now when you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very corners of your field, nor shall you gather the gleanings of your harvest.¹⁰ Nor shall you glean your vineyard, nor shall you gather the fallen fruit of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the needy and for the stranger. I am the LORD your God.
