THE THREE BIG G'S

There is a famous story about Golda Meir, who after the six-day war, received an inquiry from the Pentagon asking if they can have the renown General Moshe Dayan, architect of the victory in the war, move to the U.S.A. "Sure," said Golda, "We will give you one general in return to two of yours!" "Which ones would you like?" the Americans asked. "General Electric and General Motors!" Golda replied.

Like Israel and the U.S, Judaism too, has its "generals." The 3 big G's that are deeply embedded in the idea of what it means to be Jewish.

Grace, Gratitude and Generosity.

Grace is a word almost missing in modern times from our Jewish vocabulary. This is mainly because it is used so often by Christianity to describe "the free and unmerited favor of God, as manifested in the salvation of sinners." And thus, for many of us, holding on to a different theology, it just doesn't feel Jewish. But **grace** -Hesed - is the foundation on which Judaism exists! Many times, we sing in the sanctuary "Olam Hesed Yivaneh" the world is built of **grace**.

Our lives, our mere existence is an act of **grace**. No one can claim that they "deserved" to be born, or that they "created themselves" – no one? Not true. In Ezekiel 29:3 we read of the greatest villain in the Torah, King Pharoah himself saying: "The Nile is mine, I made (it) myself".

And according to the midrash in Genesis Rabbah 100:1 (and a much better translation of the Hebrew) what Pharoah said was really that he "made himself." According to our Rabbis the biggest act of idolatry is the belief that we are "self-created." There is a reason why we dislike Pharoah so much.

And so, if we define **grace** as "That which we don't earn and yet is given to us." primarily our lives, and the idea that God doesn't "owe us" our creation but rather created us with love, then there is no other way to live, but in a constant sense of **gratitude**.

Every morning we are told to recite Psalm 150:6 "Let every soul praise God - *Kol Ha'neshama Tehall Ya.*" There is beautiful interpretation to that phrase; Rabbi Levi tells us not to read the word (neshama) as soul, but rather read *Neshima* – breath. i.e <u>with every</u> breath we should praise and thank God for the gift of life. Jewish wisdom tells us that **gratitude** should be constant, all the time, like a flowing river. But we all know that we cannot live carrying any emotion, ALL the time, that's why we fall in and out of love, that's why we can get angry and "cool down" – emotions, including **gratitude**, are fluid by their nature.

This is where **generosity** comes in. Because when we are generous, we make sure that our understanding of **grace** expressed by our **gratitude** is constantly shared with others. When we are generous, when we give to others, the river of gratitude keeps flowing all the time. At every given moment, not just at the moment of giving, someone is feeling a sense of **gratitude** from the blessings that were shared with them. Being grateful but not generous is like being a dam in the river, you enjoy the flowing river, but it stops with you, the blessings don't continue flowing to those who live downwards along the river. For Maimonides the only way to truly show **gratitude** was to be **generous**- in many ways for him, the two are one. They do not exist separately.

Being **generous** is not living with a sense that I am obligated to give to others (that's called taxation) but rather a deep and profound understanding that I am a recipient of such goodness and I want others to

feel the same sense of **grace** and **gratitude** – because without them, we can all admit, life is somewhat deflated from its meaning.

The High Holy Days give us an opportunity to destroy the dams we have built in our lives. They give us an opportunity to examine all the times in which our actions stopped or diverted the flowing of the river of **grace**. All the times we wasted a breath on not being the best person we could be, on not being grateful.

The High Holy Days present to us an opportunity to engage in *Teshuva* (return) and I want to share A.D.M Walkers observation on **gratitude** and *Teshuva* (Return). He teaches that: "Pleasure at being favoured, however undiluted, does not amount to gratefulness in the absence of desire to make a **return** (teshuva)...what distinguishes a grateful person from (merely) a pleased or glad person is the grateful person's desire to make a **return**. More precisely, he or she wants to favour another because he or she has been favoured themselves."

Thus, the High Holy Days are the time that our temple asks for your display of generosity, for that generosity to be part of the process of Teshuva, returning to a life of gratitude and grace.

By the time you are reading these words, you should have already received your High Holy Day appeal, in the letter that was enclosed, among other things I wrote that there are many reasons why you could throw that letter straight into the recycle bin.

Some of these reasons include the belief that you don't "use" the temple that often, that you already pay your membership commitment, that you support your temple up north, that you have other priorities that need your support, or perhaps because you assume others will give generously.

And I shared with you that letter supporting Temple Judea makes a real difference.

All day, every day. Like a flowing river.

Temple Judea is the place where Jewish community is built and strengthened. It is where people come to find community and where they then come together to share each other's joys and sorrows. It is where, every day, the beauty, wisdom, and joy of Jewish life is taught and modelled for our children and grandchildren. It is where we fight against antisemitism and for a better more just and stronger Israel, where we reach out to our neighbours and together try to create a better world. It is where you will always find a listening ear, comforting hug and prayer, a feeling of connecting to something greater than yourself, a place to remember a loved one, and to explore meaning and spirituality.

It is the place where you matter, and what you do, and give matters. Because every gift – large or small matters.

The number to break this year is 368. Out of close to 700 households, last year 368 households made a pledge to share their grace and gratitude by displaying their generosity. Every year I dream of a 100% participation- And I will continue to dream of that day where we all know that every single member of our TJ family has made sure that the gifts of God keep flowing through them through their sense of grace and gratitude and acts of generosity.

L'shana tova tíchatemu!






In honor of Parshat Noah, Celebrate Shabbat and Bless Your Pet!





Shana Tovah, Temple Judea!

During the High Holy Days, we delve into deep personal reflection known as Cheshbon HaNefeshchecking in with our souls. At this time of year, our Jewish tradition inspires us to ask ourselves- how can I more meaningfully live the Jewish value of Tikkun Olam (healing our world) in the coming year? How can I begin 5783 with a renewed intention to make a positive impact on those less fortunate than myself? As we welcome the joyous holiday of Sukkot, we focus on the protection God provided us in the form of sustenance and temporary housing as we wandered in the desert for forty years. Our time spent eating and celebrating in the Sukkah helps us relive the dependency we felt while adrift in the desert, and it also helps us physically relate to those without secure housing and/or daily sustenance right here in our midst. As our tradition teaches, during Sukkot, "When a person eats and drinks, he is obligated to feed and give drink to the foreigner, orphans, widows, and other despondent, poor people. But one who locks the doors of his yard and eats and drinks only with his children and wife...this is not the joy of a mitzvah, but rather the joy of his belly (Hilkhot Yom Tov 6:18)." Right here in our affluent county, 200,000 hungry individuals experience this "wandering in the desert" as they continually face insecure housing and employment. Especially in this economic climate, local families are struggling to meet their basic needs which increases their risk of ongoing food insecurity. This year, Temple Judea will heed the Jewish imperative of caring for the poor in our midst by providing consistent volunteer service in our community. As Rav Asi teaches, "Providing charity for poor and hungry people weighs as heavily as all the other commandments of the Torah combined (Bava Batra 9a:12)." Let 5783 be the year we truly live our values as a sacred community. On November 2nd, we will distribute meals for those in need at Feeding Hope Village in Riviera Beach (9-1)- please email me if you want to join us (Rose@gotj.org)! May this be a New Year of shalom, joy, health and security for you and all in our midst and have a blessed and joyful Sukkot.
