STRONGER TOGETHER

There is no doubt that I am a better Jew today thanks to the interfaith work I have done and the wonderful friendships I have formed with dynamic faith leaders who are too many to name!

Through the years, my interfaith dialogues have included so many constructive and mutually enriching experiences that I can only remember one time where the conversation quickly turned argumentative and petty. A young seminary student asked to meet with me, and I happily agreed, though his immaturity quickly became apparent in the way he wished to bitterly argue with me. I smiled warmly and let him know, 'I will be having lunch today with Father John, and we always enjoy each other's company and learn so much from one another! I hope that one day we can have that type of relationship!

I am so grateful for the mature interfaith relationships I have experienced, and I would like to share some of the approaches and wisdom I have gained in this process.

Bishop Krister Stendahl (former presiding Lutheran bishop of Sweden and formerly of Harvard Divinity School) proposes certain ground rules for interfaith dialogue. Krister Stendahl invented the phrase "holy envy" at a 1985 press conference in Stockholm, where he was the bishop of the Church of Sweden. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints was opening a new temple, and there was some local consternation about these newcomers from Utah. So, Stendahl held a press conference to assuage people's fears.

He offered three rules for religious understanding. Number one, if you want to learn about another religion, ask its adherents and not its enemies. Number two don't compare your best to their worst. Number three, leave room for holy envy.

Barbara Brown Taylor explains that as a teacher of comparative religion, "holy envy" seemed like an intriguing way to handle students' desires to learn more about other faiths without feeling guilty or condemned. It was a way of sanctifying their deep desire to learn more about other faith traditions without losing their own.

This idea of "leaving room for holy envy" has empowered me in so many ways. It urges me to go places and to show up for experiences where I will feel out of place. It permits me to let down my defenses and to listen resiliently, seeking to understand without judging. It means that I go as a Jew, not hiding my identity being a proud and respectful ambassador for our people. It means that I appreciate diversity and at the same time I become aware of ideas, teachings, and approaches that are a part of Judaism that I have not been paying much attention to. One of the many examples of "holy envy" happened in a mosque. Those of you who have been to a mosque for prayer, may be familiar with how Muslims prepare for prayer, washing hands, taking off their shoes and sitting quietly almost in a meditation-like state. This invites me to think about how I prepare for prayer. What could be a mindful practice to enter prayer? In the Talmud, we learn that there were pious Jews, who before sitting down to pray would first meditate for an hour to be able to bring full concentration and intention to reciting the prayers' words -- and after the service would meditate for an hour in order to let the prayers fully percolate into their hearts and souls. Two hours of contemplative practice for

every one hour of liturgical prayer! (Talmud Berachot 5a) Upon visiting the mosque, I experienced "holy envy" and now I am more aware of how I prepare for prayer.

When I was studying in university in Israel, my friends and I went to the library to study for exams. We all had different majors, I was studying history, but my friends were studying literature, art, philosophy, and I was surprised when I realized we were all learning about Christianity. All these Jewish students, at a university in Israel were learning about Christianity because while we all knew Hebrew and could sing all the Shabbat prayers, our knowledge of Christianity was weak. To pursue our academic studies, to appreciate art, understand literature and examine Jewish life in historical context, we needed to learn much more.

Facing Common Goals

Through the RAC, the Religious Action Center, the Reform Movement works with various religious groups on several social justice issues. Despite certain theological differences, the Religious Action Center has found common ground with other religious groups, such as the National Council of Churches, United Methodist Church, Baptist Joint Committee on Religious Liberty, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, and the Islamic Council of North America. Through coalition work, we have been able to set aside our differences and work toward common goals, such as preserving basic fundamental human rights, cherished by faith communities.

Here at Temple Judea, we are so grateful for the wonderful partners from our local faith communities that have been established years ago, and we are excited to be on going interfaith work such as the volunteer work with St. Mark's Episcopal Church and the Freedom Seder we led with Christ Family Worship Assembly. This year we will be participating in the Interfaith Thanksgiving and are planning other social action events throughout the year.

Rabbi Yitz Greenberg was once asked why do Jews need to partner with other faith communities? He responded, "So that we Jews do not get a spiritual hernia!" I certainly agree that we are stronger together, but I would add that interfaith work helps make me an even better Jew. Shalom Temple Judea!

It's that time of year we all love- when our south Florida "winter" begins, and our northern neighbors look at us with envy as their bitter chill begins to take hold. It becomes easy to forget that this gorgeous time of year may be the most difficult for the vulnerable in our midst- those who are homeless or facing housing insecurity. The RAC (Religious Action Center) reports that homelessness is primarily caused by a lack of affordable housing. A lack of affordable housing increases existing disparities in educational and professional opportunities, access to medical services and sufficient food, and overall quality of life. The Palm Beach School Board recently announced that there are 3,000 school-aged homeless children in the county. WPTV recently released a series entitled "Priced out of Paradise," which featured a local nurse whose rent suddenly tripled in price. Since then, she has been going to work with a smile everyday while sleeping with her young daughter in their car every night. A disabled veteran and mother who lost her housing after her rent recently skyrocketed shared, "I never expected to be one of these people that goes through a tough time like this." Although these experiences may feel different then our own on an individual level, Jews have faced homelessness since the very beginning of our story, from wandering in the desert for 40 years, to the exile from Israel and our later expulsions from every country in Europe and the Middle East. We have relied on our community's resilience and support to sustain us through the hardest of times. The Talmud explains that the mitzvah "a poor person be granted sufficient for what he lacks, according to what is lacking to him" means we are required to provide a hungry person with food and a homeless person with a safe place to live. As we begin to appreciate the cooler weather, let us open our hearts to those in our midst without the comfort of safe housing by donating to organizations such as the Homeless Coalition of Palm Beach County and Faith in Action. Another way to assist our local homeless population is to keep informed about local politics. In November, consider voting for the housing bond issue on the ballot, providing affordable local housing for essential workers such as our local teachers and firemen who can no longer afford to live in the communities they serve.

We read in the book of Proverbs, "One that oppresses the poor blasphemes his maker, but one that is gracious to the poor honors God." Honor God by serving food with us at the Feeding Hope Village on November 2nd (email <u>Rose@gotj.org</u> to sign up) - we look forward to joining you in this sacred work. As we welcome the (slight) chill in the area and appreciate our Thanksgiving feast spent with loved ones, may we each continue to honor God through our actions in the community.
